

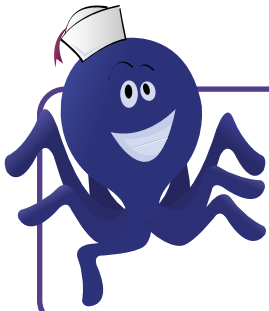
About This Activity

This activity worksheet is designed for the first year piano student. It continues to drill and practice note naming skills as it introduces the musical interval.
